Property Tax Exemptions

Knollwood City Council passed ordinance O2008-1217 which establishes the City of Knollwood's ability to limit property taxes on the homestead of disabled persons and persons age 65 or older and to provide exemptions on recreational travel trailers.

Door to Door Solicitors

A few residents recently complained about door to door solicitors in our community. Knollwood Village used to have a rule against door to door solicitation; however, a supreme court ruling several years ago invalidated all such rules. Now, only residents themselves have the right to decide who they want to knock on their door, and you must make your preference known.

If you do not want to be bothered by strangers knocking on your door, you should post a "No Solicitors" or "No trespassing" sign in your yard or on your house. If a solicitor knocks on your door or comes in your yard anyway, you can then call the sheriff's department and press charges for trespassing.

For your convenience, a "no solicitation" sign is printed on the back of this newsletter.
